

# Questions, Reflections & Prayer Points

Now that you've listened to the teaching on Joshua chapter 10, go through the questions below and use some paper or your computer to write down your answers.

## Questions:

1. In spite of past victories and because of past defeats God took the time to encourage Joshua telling him not to be afraid. In what areas of your life do you need reassurance of the Lord's presence and power?
2. Verse 14 ends with "...the Lord fought for Israel." How is this obvious from verses 9-15?
3. Why do you think it's often hard to trust God for the future, even when He's been faithful in the past?
4. What does the miracle of the lengthened day teach you about God's character?

## Reflections:

The past tense statement "I have given them into your hands" in verse 8 is significant: God had already decided the outcome, but Israel still had to go out and fight. Just because the battle belongs to the Lord doesn't mean you and I won't have to step out in faith.

The Promised Land was supposed to be a land of blessing for Israel and yet, it was also a land of conflict. Think about how the Lord is using the conflict and battles in your life so that you might learn to lay hold of the blessings that He has for you.

The battles in the book of Joshua are a picture of Christians battling everything in our lives that is sinful and wrong. (Imagine having your foot on the neck of everything that threatens the integrity of your testimony for Christ!)

## Prayer Points:

Pray for a new expectation in your heart to see God moving supernaturally in your life as you fight the battles of faith.

Ask the Lord to give you dominion over the sins with which you struggle, just as if you were placing your feet the necks of your enemies.

Ask the Lord to anchor your heart to the cross of Christ so you will remain steadfast and ready to fight any battle that comes your way.
